eloved, let us love one another; for love is of God, and he who loves is born of God and knows God. He who does not love does not know God; for God is love. In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the expiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No man has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and his love is perfected in us. By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his own Spirit. HOLY COMMUNION. Baptized Christians may receive the Blessed Sacrament. The Sacred Host will be placed upon your tongue or in the palm of your hand after which the Chalice is offered. Should you wish to receive by intinction, leave the Host on your palm. The Chalice Bearer will dip It in the consecrated Wine and place It on your tongue. If you are not receiving the Sacrament, please cross your arms as the Priest approaches so that a blessing may be said.

IF AGE OR INFIRMITY makes it difficult for you to come to the altar rail, please indicate to the Ushers that you would like help to the Communion rail, or that you would prefer Holy Communion brought to you in your pew.

PLEASE ENSURE THAT CELLPHONES are turned off during Mass. If God is going to speak to you at Mass, he will use other means!
